To the People of Oklahoma:

I am pleased to issue the November monthly investment performance report for the Office of the State Treasurer. I trust you will find it thorough and in keeping with my commitment to provide full and complete disclosure of all activities within my office. As always, my staff and I are available to answer any questions you might have.

Market Conditions

Treasury bond prices continued to fall during November, as investors desired to be compensated for expectations of a rise in inflation and the forecast of an interest rate increase by the end of the year. Bond yields rise as prices fall. The presidential election outcome was a strong factor affecting the treasury market. The benchmark 10-year treasury gained 55 basis points during the month to close at 2.38%, reflecting its highest level since July 2015. The 2-year treasury yield was 1.11% gaining 28 basis points and the 30-year came in at 3.03% picking-up 45 basis points.

Stock market earnings were strong, with the Dow Jones industrial average ending the month at 19,123 reflecting a year-to-date increase of 9.8%. The S&P 500 came in at 2,198 with gains of 7.6% for the year and the Nasdaq composite rose to 5,323 and reflected a yearly gain of 6.3%. The stock market experienced a rally due to the presidential election being decided and the positive results of many economic indicators released during the month.

On November 2 the Federal Reserve decided to leave interest rates unchanged. The vote by the Federal Open Market Committee was not unanimous, with dissenters Kansas City Fed President Ester George and Cleveland Fed President Loretta Mester. This was the fifth dissent this year for Ms. George and the second for Ms. Mester. The Committee issued a statement saying "the case for an increase in the federal funds rate has continued to strengthen but decided, for the time being, to wait for some further evidence of continued progress toward its objectives". Expectations are high the Fed will raise rates at the December meeting, as economic data begins to resonate firming inflation and continued progress in the labor market.

Economic Developments

The Labor Department released the unemployment rate at 4.9% for October, slightly decreasing from 5% the month before. The unemployment rate has fluctuated between 4.7% and 5.0% for the last twelve months. The Labor Department said job gains for September were revised from 156,000 to 191,000 and came in at 161,000 for October. The underemployment rate declined to 9.5%, dropping 0.2% and being the lowest since 2008. Average hourly earnings were up 2.8% year-over-year.

The October headline consumer price index (CPI) grew by 0.4%, meeting economist expectations. The increase was attributed to a rise in both the shelter and gasoline indexes. Headline CPI increased by 1.6% year-over-year. Core CPI, which excludes food and energy, increased by 0.1% month-over-month, which was lower than projections. Producer prices were unchanged during the month. The core producer price index declined by 0.2% month-over-month and grew 1.2% year-over-year, both less than expected.

Retail sales for October increased 0.8% and revisions were made to both August and September data by +0.3%.

Sales gains were found in building materials, clothing and grocery stores, which had experienced stagnant growth during the year. Online sales also showed improvement. Decreases in sales activity were found in electronic stores, department stores and restaurants. Economists believe fourth quarter spending could reflect a rebound from the slowing found during the previous quarter.

The seasonal adjusted annual rate of total existing-home sales were 5.60 million in October. Existing-home sales were upwardly revised for September to 5.49 million. October's sales pace was 5.9% above a year ago and surpassed June's pace as the highest since February 2007. The National Association of Realtors reported that "October's strong sales gain was widespread throughout the country and can be attributed to the release of the unrealized pent-up demand that held back many would-be buyers over the summer because of tight supply".

The Bureau of Economic Analysis said the second estimate of gross domestic product (GDP) for the third quarter was increased from 2.9% to 3.2%. Exports increased at an annual rate of 10% during the third quarter. One of the most volatile components of GDP, inventory investment expanded during the third quarter after struggling for the last five quarters. Consumer spending also contributed to the solid quarterly growth.

Portfolio Commentary: Performance, Diversification, and Strategy

The Treasurer's portfolio yielded 1.75% in November with a weighted average maturity of 861 days. The year-to-date monthly average investable base was \$3.18 billion, in comparison to \$3.76 billion a year ago. Portfolio diversification continues to be sound. U.S. Treasury Inflation-Protected Securities represented 1% of holdings, and U.S. government sponsored enterprises accounted for approximately 42% of the portfolio. Mortgage-backed securities were 38%, municipal bonds were 1% and Certificates of Deposit represented 4% of assets. Money market mutual funds were 8% and OK Invest, which is comprised of various State agency funds, represented 4% of the total portfolio. State Bond Issues (at 1%) and foreign bonds (at less than 1%) made up the balance of funds invested. In keeping with the State's statutory investment objectives, the portfolio strategy continues to seek safety, liquidity, and return on investment, in that order. Laddered bond maturities and a buy-and-hold strategy were utilized. Market observation for investment opportunities were considered in order to maximize income within investment parameters and the current low interest rate environment.

Collateralization

All funds under the control of this office requiring collateralization were secured at rates ranging from 102% to 110%, depending on the type of investment.

Payments, Fees, and Commissions

All securities were purchased or sold on a net basis utilizing competitive bidding where practicable, with no additional fees or commissions known to the State Treasurer. Bank fees and mutual fund operating expenses are detailed in the attached pages, as is the earnings split between the Treasurer and the master custodian bank on securities lending income.

Total Funds Invested

Funds available for investment, at cost basis, include the State Treasurer's investments at \$2,960,052,379 and State Agency balances in OK Invest at \$2,324,721,886 for a total of \$5,284,774,265.



In December 2015, the Treasurer estimated earnings to the Board of Equalization for Fiscal Year 2017. The amount estimated was \$52,000,000. Year-to-date actual earnings are recorded on a cash basis of accounting.

Explanation of Performance Comparison November 30, 2016

The following page presents market rates of return on the Securities portion of the General Account and of the State's aggregated State Agency Accounts. The figures, which are dollar- and time-weighted, where appropriate, are calculated using the percentage change in market value (inclusive of accrued income) from the end of the prior month to the end of the reporting month. To ensure the integrity of the data, this information is provided by the Treasurer's custodian bank acting in its capacity as an external third party. As such, performance measurement is presently confined to those investments which are custodied at Northern Trust Company.



NOTE: Pursuant to Oklahoma State Statute Title 62, Section 89.7, all known fees are to be reported. The money market mutual fund fees reported above are shown at the contracted rate. Due to the current low interest rate environment, a portion of these fees have been voluntarily waived by the provider. An adjustment to actual fees will be presented in the Annual Report.

The State Treasurer participates in a Securities Lending Program with Northern Trust Company acting as lending agent. Northern retains 15% of the revenues generated as compensation for services. Its share for the month was \$0.00. Pursuant to Oklahoma State Statute Title 62 Section 90, the State Treasurer retains the first \$450,000 of securities lending revenues in a revolving fund. These funds are used to pay custody and other banking fees. Any revenue not needed for this purpose is deposited to the General Fund.
